Publishing instructions for authors

I. General publishing information

1. Manuscripts and letters:

It is a prerequisite for submitting a manuscript to the editorial office that the work must not have been published before or submitted for publication elsewhere. It is up to the editors to decide whether to accept the manuscripts. The author bears exclusive academic responsibility for the content of the individual articles.

To ensure high quality, the articles are subject to a peer review process before publication in the Journal for Public Law (ZöR).

2. Submitting manuscripts:

Manuscripts for all areas of the journal must be submitted in an up-to-date word-processing format and sent to the editors by email (Univ.-Prof. Dr. András Jakab and Univ.-Prof. Dr. Sebastian Schmid at the editorial address: <zoer@plus.ac.at>). The topic must be chosen in consultation with the editors.

3. Address for correspondence:

4. Galley proofs:

Our typesetters will email these to you directly as a PDF file after you have forwarded your manuscript; please print out the file, correct it legibly and return it to the Production department at Verlag Österreich within five working days after receipt (Ms Petra NASCHENWENG, email: p.naschenweng@verlagoesterreich.at). Please limit your corrections to the strict minimum (typos, etc.) and avoid making any costly reformulations, additions, deletions, etc.

5. Literar-Mechana, rights to use the work and scope of rights:

It is a prerequisite for submitting a manuscript to the journal's editorial office that the work must not have been published before or submitted for publication elsewhere. Copyright: the articles published in this journal are protected by copyright. All rights reserved, in particular the right to translate into foreign languages. Legal protection also applies with regard to databases and similar devices. No part of this journal may be reproduced in any way by photocopy, microfilm or other processes, or transmitted into a machine-readable language, in particular a language readable by data processing machines, beyond the limits provided for by copyright law without the written permission of the publisher. The rights of reproduction, in particular, via lectures, radio or television broadcasts, on magnetic soundtrack or in electronic, digital or similar format, are also reserved.

In the event that a submitted manuscript is accepted and published, the exclusive right to use the work for all languages, which shall be unlimited with respect to time and place, will be transferred from the author to the publisher. This applies in particular to the right to publish, copy in all technical processes, circulate, make available to the public and exploit in any form, including in electronic form. The latter includes, in particular, the right to store in databases, the right to reproduce on storage media of all kinds and the right to output data from databases in all forms, including sending and circulating duplicates to users of databases. Submission of the manuscript shall be deemed a declaration of consent by the author to the granting of all rights. In the case of articles written by working groups, it is assumed that the publication has been approved by all the authors involved, and that they all agree to the granting of all rights to the publisher.

The exclusive publishing right granted at the end of the calendar year following publication of the article shall not expire after data exploitation via databases. For the duration of the contract, the author grants the publisher all rights and statutory remuneration and participation rights exercised by the copyright collection society, Literar-Mechana, according to their articles of association, rights administration agreement and distribution plan for joint contribution. The author agrees that the publisher shall be directly paid the publishing share to which they are entitled as per the relevant distribution plans of the copyright collection society, Literar-Mechana, whereby the author undertakes to confirm to Literar-Mechana the granting of rights to the publisher when registering the work. This shall not affect the author's share. The copyright collecting societies' distribution provisions shall apply to the payment and settlement of the rights administered by the copyright collecting societies and the legal remuneration and participation claims. The use of names, trade names, product descriptions, etc. in this journal, even without special mention, shall not mean that these names are freely available for general use under trademark protection legislation.
